PREP 4 ANIMAL CARE

Based at our Wigfield Farm campus, this course is ideal if you are interested in a career working with animals introducing the main principles and practices of animal care and welfare.

An introduction to animal care and welfare from managing a pet shop or grooming dogs to caring for exotic animals, this course gives you a broad introduction to the animal care industry.

- Feeding and watering animals

- Maintaining health and wellbeing of animals
- Handling and restraint of animals
- Safe and effective working practices in Land Based Studies

ANIMAL MANAGEMENT

Based at our Wigfield Farm campus, this programme is for learners who wish to develop an expertise in the care and welfare of a variety of animals and prepare themselves to work in this interesting industry.

You will further develop your knowledge of animal biology, care and management. In the second year you will undertake a work placement within an approved organisation to enhance your practical skills.

Course themes:

- Animal anatomy and physiology
- Animal handling and safe working
- Understanding animal behaviour and communication
- Aquatics husbandry and management
- Wildlife populations, ecology and conservation

Studying Animal Care at Barnsley College will enable you to develop skills for a range of careers such as:

VETERINARY NURSE

EARNING POTENTIAL: £15K - £30K

A veterinary nurse provides assistance to vets in the treatment and care of sick or injured animals, assists the veterinary surgeon during surgical and medical treatments of animals, prepares the operating theatre, sterilises equipment and assists in theatre as required.

CONSERVATION OR ENVIRONMENTAL PROFESSIONAL

EARNING POTENTIAL: £21K - £37K

Conservation and environmental professionals are responsible for the day-to-day running and management of areas of the countryside and the wider environment. They carry out practical conservation activities and assist in promoting awareness of the natural environment. They also assist with ecological surveys to identify plant and animal species, map their habitat and draw up conservation plans.

ZOO KEEPER

EARNING POTENTIAL: £10K - £24K

Zoo keepers look after animals in zoos and safari parks. They also work in aquariums and sometimes in the wild.



GRAPHIC DESIGN

Graphic designers are visual communicators; creating and combining words, symbols, and images to dynamically and professionally express ideas and messages.

This course aims to identify and develop new and exciting talent for this ever growing communications specialism.

You will study all areas of graphic design, photography and digital media including web design.

You will also get the chance to develop your work through educational and gallery visits including international residential trips to cities including New York and Paris.

FASHION AND CLOTHING

The Fashion and Clothing Extended Diploma is a practical, work related course.

Throughout the course you investigate and develop both your creativity and theoretical knowledge of fashion and clothing.

You will produce a portfolio of design work including a sample folder of techniques, pattern cutting work, practical fashion and clothing projects and a small catwalk collection which you will showcase in our end of year exhibition.

You will also get the chance to go on educational and gallery visits.

Entry requirements:

Four GCSEs at grade A* to C plus English grade 4 or above.

Level 3

Foundation Diploma

This qualification aims to educate you to make informed decisions which will facilitate your progression, primarily but not exclusively to appropriate higher education in art, design and media.

We build on your prior experience, linking skills already acquired, with ideas and challenges which will extend your critical independence.

This course explores a wide range of art and design activities including media experimentation and research.

Course themes:

You will specialise in one of the following areas:

Entry requirements:

- One A Level or Level 3 Diploma qualification. (Individual consideration will be given if you are 21 years of age or over with no formal qualifications)

GRAPHIC DESIGNER

Designer, Advertising, Graphic Artist

EARNING POTENTIAL: £16K - £34K

Graphic designers use illustrative, sound, visual and multimedia techniques to convey a message for information, entertainment, advertising, promotion or publicity purposes.

FASHION BUYER

EARNING POTENTIAL: £14K - £39K

Buyers and procurement officers organise and undertake the buying of raw materials, and merchandise from manufacturers, importers, wholesalers and other sources.

This career has grown by 8% over the last 2 years, and is expected to grow by 4% over the next 4 years. Currently 7,112 buyers and procurement officers are employed in the region.

STAGE SET DESIGNER

EARNING POTENTIAL: £13K - £38K

Stage designers are responsible for the visual aspects of a theatre production. It is their job to help bring the drama to life by creating a convincing environment for the actors to work in. They may be involved in costumes and props as well as sets and locations. Set designers do the same for TV or film productions.

STUDY PROGRAMMES

The Learning for Living and Work department supports learners with a learning disability or difficulty to prepare them for either independent living or supported employment.

Comprehensive learning and social support is available to ensure you progress and achieve your personal goals.

Entry requirements:

You must have a s139a, Learning Difficulties Education Health Care Plan or Statement of Educational Need subject to commissioning by the local authority and be aged 16 to 24 years old.

You will have an initial assessment which will determine a highly personalised study programme to suit your individual needs and interests which could include:

- Personal and social development/employability skills
- Numeracy/Literacy/ICT skills

You will usually work towards an accredited Entry Level or Level 1 study programme and follow an individual/bespoke timetable.

TAKING THE FIRST STEP

There are four steps within the study programme which enable you to begin at a suitable starting point:

Step 1: For those students with complex additional needs.

Step 2: Programmes designed to support learners looking to develop their independent living skills.

Step 3: For learners aiming to develop their employability skills, including volunteering and work experience opportunities.

Step 4: Supported Internship Programme: Combining work experience with an employer and time in college to gain a qualification.

Your individual learning plan will be tailored to meet your needs and interests. Staff will work very closely with you to support your transition to further study, independent living, day opportunities or voluntary/paid employment.

SUPPORTED INTERNSHIP

The Supported Internship Programme will enable you to gain skills needed in the workplace, increase confidence and prepare you for the world of work. You will spend between one and two days per week in college studying towards an Entry Level 3 or Level 1 qualification and up to three days each week with an employer. A member of staff will work closely with you in the workplace to help you learn new tasks and help you settle in to the job.

TRANSITION LINK PROGRAMME

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YEAR 11 APPLICATION PROCESS



Step 1 - Search

Step 2 - Apply

Students can apply for the study programme of their choice from the beginning of September 2016 by completing a paper application, via the college website or UCAS Progress.



Step 3 - College interview

Students are invited in to college to attend an interview with a tutor from their chosen subject(s). Interviews usually take place Wednesday afternoons between 3.00pm and 4.30pm, starting in November 2016.



Step 4 - College place

After the interview, students will either be offered a place on their chosen study programme or referred to a more appropriate one.



Step 5 - Subject taster

Students are invited in to college to take part in a taster session in the subject they have chosen.

Step 6 - Enrolment

An invitation and enrolment pack will be sent out at the beginning of August 2017 giving students all the information they will need to enrol onto their study programme at the end of August 2017.


