Fees and finance

Our tuition fees are £5,995* per year for full-time courses. Part-time course fees are calculated on a course-by-course basis.

How does the fee system work?

Eligible students can apply for a Tuition Fee Loan from Student Finance England at the same time as applying for other maintenance support.

There are no up-front fees to pay and you will only start repaying your student loan once you have left university and are earning over £21,000* a year.

Help with living costs

Financial support with living costs is available for full-time, eligible students. The amount that students receive depends on their total annual household income.

Maintenance Loan

You may be eligible to receive up to £8,430* per year as a Maintenance Loan if you are living away from home and up to £7,097* if you are living at home. The Maintenance Loan is repaid alongside the Tuition Fee Loan once you start earning over £21,000 per year.

Help for trainee teachers

Some teaching courses attract government funding. For more information see getintoteaching.education.gov.uk

Help for parents

Childcare Grant and Parent's Learning Allowance can help parents to balance the cost of childcare and study. Students with an adult who depends on them financially may also be eligible for Adult Dependents' Grant.*

Differences between college and UCB

Learning environment

You will spend less time in class than at college and depending on the subject you study you could learn in different environments, such as art studios or recording studios.

The amount of teaching hours you will have might be less but you will be expected to undertake independent study outside of the classroom. For example, you may only have 12 hours of lessons a week and then the rest of the time is to be used for self-study.

Teaching and learning styles

The role of Higher Education lecturers is to give you an outline and the skills to allow you to investigate your subject. This gives you the opportunity to learn independently, find your own sources of information and analyse them. You will become responsible for your own learning so if you haven't read a certain book or completed a piece of homework, it is your own responsibility.

Assessments

The types of assignment you may be given

could vary from a written essay, to a report, presentation or undertaking a placement and being observed.

'Personal/character' changes

You will learn transferable skills that will enhance your employment opportunities. You will become more independent and learn to manage your time and solve problems. You'll discover things about yourself that you might not have known before and maybe even make lifelong friends. You will learn to use your own initiative and make your own decisions.



How to apply

Full-time applicants

To apply for a full-time course you need to submit your application via the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS). www.ucas.com

Applications for 2018 entry should reach UCAS by **15 January 2018**. Don't worry if you miss the deadline, you can still apply to study at UCB via UCAS up until the summer. However, please be aware that offers are dependent on the availability of places so we would advise you to apply early.

If your current school or college is registered with UCAS just ask your tutor or careers advisor for help. If you're not currently in education but are based in the UK you can apply online through UCAS independently.

The UCAS website provides full instructions on the application process.

Once you've applied we'll communicate with you regularly throughout the whole process, from interview to offer and enrolment.

Post-application interviews

Once you have applied to UCB you will be invited to an informal interview to talk to tutors in more detail about what the course entails. There will be a chance to take a campus tour at this stage if you haven't already visited us.

Find the right course for you

Deciding which course to choose can be daunting but we have a wide range so there is sure to be something to suit you.

We offer **undergraduate degrees**, these are Bachelor of Arts with Honours (BA Hons) or Bachelor of Science with Honours (BSc Hons). Which one you graduate with depends on the course you choose. The course title will indicate which degree it is.

We also offer **foundation degrees, Higher National Certificates (HNCs) and Higher National Diplomas (HNDs)**. You

can usually do a final year top-up after successfully completing a foundation degree or an HND to be awarded with a degree.

Our **Teacher Training courses** are offered both at undergraduate (Certificate in Education) and postgraduate level (PGCE).

Student Services

Whether you need advice about accommodation, finances or careers, our Student Services team can help. Friendly staff are there to help you with all aspects of campus life.

We also offer advice on health and wellbeing and you can see an advisor in a one-to-one appointment or attend a drop-in session.





Disability and Dyslexia Service

We offer a range of support and flexible study strategies to any student who has a disability, a specific learning difficulty such as dyslexia or dyspraxia, or a chronic health condition, including any mental health issues such as depression or anxiety.

We want to work with you as soon as possible, even before you start at UCB, to support your transition and identify what you require to enable you to fully engage with your course and to get the most out of your studies.

Our staff will work with you on a confidential basis to explore what you need throughout your course in order to achieve your full academic potential, without this being compromised by your health or disability.

Our service can offer you the following:

- Dyslexia advice and guidance.
- Advice and assistance with applying for Disabled Students' Allowances (DSA) and arranging a Study Needs Assessment.
- Advice to your academic team on adjustments that you may need.
- Liaison with central services including extended library loans.
- Liaison with external agencies to coordinate the practical support you may need.
- Advice on disability issues such as campus access or assistive software.
- Arranging your essential support workers such as a dyslexia tutor, a study mentor or a British Sign Language Interpreter.
- Flexible exam arrangements.

What happens when you apply?

If you identify a disability or any long term diagnosis on your UCAS application

we will send you an information pack and registration form for our service. Once you return that to us, together with your evidence of disability, you will be offered an appointment with the Disability Adviser to explore what you might need for the course and, in most cases, to begin the process of completing your DSA funding application.

This is a confidential, informal meeting which gives you the chance to tell us how you feel your disability, health issue or specific learning difficulty might impact upon your studies. The sooner we make contact with you the better so that, where possible, your support strategies can be agreed before you start your course.

As an international student, choosing where to study in the UK is one of the most important decisions that you will ever make. An important influence when looking for a location is that it is safe and affordable - this is why Barnsley is the perfect choice for you.

Barnsley is situated among the breathtaking Pennines. With a population of under 100,000 people coupled with its rural scenery, Barnsley is an ideal place to absorb English culture and makes for a peaceful place to study. The town is only 19km north of Sheffield and 27km south of Leeds so the hustle and bustle of city life is only a short

train journey away. Barnsley is well known for its football team, has a strong embrace of the arts with a number of galleries, theatres and music venues and the citizens are friendly and passionate.

The International Office

The International Office exists to enable you to make the most of your time here at Barnsley. We are happy to answer any questions you may have concerning our courses and entry requirements. The International Office acts as a student service throughout your time at UCB where you can get help or ask for advice regarding Tier 4 issues.

Tuition Fees and Living Expenses

In order to obtain a Tier 4 visa, you must be able to demonstrate that you can pay for your course fees plus living costs of £1,015

per month (for a minimum of nine months - £9,135). This amount must be held in a bank account for at least 28 days, and you must evidence this when applying for a Tier 4 visa. Further guidance is available at

Pre-Arrival and On Arrival Information

Before you leave your country, we will communicate with you regularly and provide you with essential information to help you with your application, support your visa application, and help to make your journey to us a safe and smooth one. On arrival, we may be able to offer a transport



service from both Manchester Airport and Heathrow Airport at the start of each academic year. For further information regarding costs and the process for airport pick-up, please contact the International Office.

We will organise a welcome programme of events that includes information sessions, tours of the campus, town and region. We encourage all students to get involved with activities outside of the academic environment, whether that be joining a sports team, cultural society or participating in community life as a volunteer. Getting involved gives you the chance to meet new friends, develop new skills, improve your English, learn about different cultures and, ultimately, enhance your employability within a global career market.

International Applications

University Campus Barnsley has Tier 4 Sponsor Status from UK Visa and Immigration (UKVI). Although most courses do not have a deadline for application, we recommend that you apply as early as possible as some courses do fill up and we may close applications early. It is not necessary to wait for your final certificates, transcripts or references before you apply. We do ask you to check the entry requirements for your country before you apply via.

English Language

You must have a good level of English proficiency so that you can follow your chosen course. A minimum IELTS score of 5.0 overall (minimum 4.5 per component)

or equivalent is required for our HNC/D and foundation degree programmes (Levels 3, 4 and 5), and a minimum IELTS score of 5.5 overall (minimum 5.5 per component) for our degree programmes (Level 6).
